International Guest Presenters



Dr Cherrie Abraham - Montreal, Canada

Dr Abraham, completed medical school and general surgery in Halifax at Dalhousie University. Assistant Professor, Surgery, McGill University, Montreal and Staff Vascular and Endovascular Surgeon at the Jewish General Hospital, since 2003. He was instrumental in starting Advanced Aortic Intervention Programs (fenestrated and branched endovascular aneurysm repair) in Vancouver, Edmonton, Winnipeg, London, Hamilton, Toronto General, St. Mikes, Ottawa, Montreal, and Halifax. He performed the first ever endovascular branched arch graft for the treatment of an aneurysm of the transverse aortic arch in October 2009

Professor Joseph Bavaria - Philadelphia, USA

Professor Bavaria, Brooke Roberts/William Maul Measey Professor of Surgery and the Director of the Thoracic Aortic Surgery Program. His clinical interests involve complex aortic diseases, cardiopulmonary transplantation, and cardiac valve surgery. Dr Bavaria has published extensively on issues regarding thoracic aortic surgery, lung transplantation, and circulation management for complex thoracic aortic reconstruction. He leads an active cardio-aortic clinical research group and is the national and institutional primary investigator for over 15 industry-sponsored, FDA, and IDE Phase I, II and III trials. He is a member of the Society of Thoracic Surgeons and the Pennsylvania Association of Thoracic Surgery.

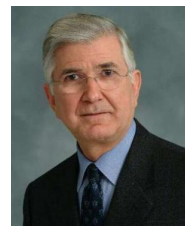


Professor Duke Cameron - Baltimore, USA

Professor Cameron, the inaugural James T. Dresher Sr. Professor of Cardiac Surgery, Johns Hopkins, is recognized as a leader in surgical innovation, clinical excellence, and for his commitment to the education of young surgeons. He is considered a national expert in pediatric cardiac surgery, the pathophysiology of cardiopulmonary bypass and surgery for Marfan Syndrome. Now a professor of surgery and of pediatrics, Dr. Cameron focuses on the surgical treatment of cardiovascular complications of Marfan Syndrome. Author of more than 100 papers in peer-review journals and 13 book chapters.

Professor Tirone David - Toronto, Canada

Professor David, is a Professor of Surgery at the University of Toronto, Chief of Cardiac Surgery at Toronto General Hospital, and the holder of the Melanie Munk Chair at the Peter Munk Cardiac Centre. He has developed numerous operative procedures to treat patients with heart valve disease, complications of myocardial infarction, and thoracic aneurysms. He received the highest civilian honor in Canada in 1996, the Order of Canada. He was elected University Professor in 2004, the highest honor the University of Toronto bestows to its professors.



Professor Roberto Di Bartolomeo - Bologna, Italy

Professor Di Bartolomeo is the Director of the Cardiac Surgery Unit at the Cardiovascular Department of the Alma Mater - University of Bologna (October 2002 – Present). Speciality interests include: Surgical treatment of thoracic and cardiovascular diseases, mitral and aortic valve repair, minimally invasive valve surgery, thoracic aneurysms, homografts, use of alternative conduits in coronary artery surgery. Author of 260 scientific publications in national and international journals.

Professor Gebrine El Khoury - Brussels, Belgium

Professor El Khoury is head of the Department of Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery at St-Luc Hospital with Membership to the Belgian, French and European Association for Cardiothoracic Surgery to name a few. He specialises in Adult Cardiac Surgery, General Thoracic Surgery and Peripheral Vascular Surgery. Dr El Khoury's interest included valve reconstruction and repair, aortic root reconstruction (remodelling), aortic valve: Ross; homograft; stentless, aortic dissection I (remodelling), mitral repair (Carpentier techniques, Gore-Tex Neo Chordae), mitral homograft and arterial evascularisation (ITA, GEA, sequential...)



Professor Ludwig Von-Segesser - Lausanne, Switzerland

Professor Von-Segesser, Head of the Department of Cardiovascular Surgery, University Hospital Vaudois, CHUV, Lausanne, Switzerland in 1995. He has a longstanding interest for research in cardiopulmonary bypass, modification of blood exposed synthetic surfaces, and mechanical circulatory support, as well as paediatric and adult cardio-vascular surgery. He has published over 600 articles, is member of more than thirty scientific societies, and ten editorial boards including Editor-in-chief of the European Journal of Cardiothoracic Surgery (2000-2010) and Founding editor of Interactive Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery.

Dr David Spielvogel - New York, USA

Dr Spielvogel is the Program Director, Heart Transplantation and Associate Professor, Section of Cardiothoracic Surgery at the Westchester Medical Center, Valhalla, New York. Dr Spielvogel specialises in adult cardiac surgery, thoracic aortic surgery and cardiac transplantation. His interests include: Aortic Surgery, Thoracic Endografts, Thoracic Transplantation, Mechanical Cardiac Assist, Mitral Valve Repair.

Abstract Submission

General Guidelines

Scientific papers are invited for oral presentations for the Video Abstract Presentation Session. In order for your abstract to be considered for presentation in this session it must contain video content focusing on novel procedures, interesting surgical techniques and challenging cases.

Authors should submit a standard type abstract written in English as well as the actual video content to Taylored Images no later than 1700 (EST) on Friday 02 March 2012. Abstracts received after this date will not be accepted.

All submissions are subject to review by the Scientific Program Committee. If accepted for presentation, no changes will be accepted to their content.

The standard abstract should provide sufficient information to allow the reader to fully assess the aims, methods, results and implications of the work undertaken.

All presentations and content is limited to a total of 15 minutes: 10 minutes total presentation time and 5 minute discussion / questions and answers.

Layout

- Abstracts must be submitted as an A4 page (210mm x 297mm)
- Portrait orientation
- Margins are all to be 20mm
- Text should be single spaced
- Font should be Arial typeface and 12 point character size

Title and Author

- Each of the below need to be at the top of the abstract, each on a new line:
- The title (UPPER CASE)
- The name(s) of the author(s) – please omit university degrees and titles
- The name of the presenter to be underlined
- Affiliation(s), city and country – please omit street address and postcode
- Leave two lines before commencing the body of the text

Section Headings and Paragraphs

- The title of each section is to be bold & left justified
- Leave a 6-space indentation at the beginning of each new paragraph. Leave a 1 line space between each paragraph
- Graphs, tables and references may be used throughout the abstract but must remain within the defined one-page limit

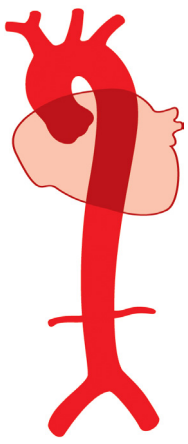
